These parents may be unable to commit to regular treatment over longer periods of time. Triple P - Primary Care can also be offered to families with complex needs, where access to more intensive interventions is not immediately available.

Nurturing Parenting Program - The Nurturing Parenting Programs are validated, trauma-informed, family-centered programs designed to build nurturing skills as alternatives to abusive parenting and child rearing attitudes and practices. The ultimate outcomes are to stop the generational cycle of child abuse by building nurturing parenting skills; reduce the rate of recidivism; reduce the rate of juvenile delinquency and alcohol abuse; and lower the rate of teenage pregnancies. The programs feature activities to foster positive parenting skills and self-nurturing, home practice exercises, family nurturing time, and activities to promote positive brain development in children birth to 18 years.
