Parent Pop-Up

If you have a child in the Cloverbud Program and have registered your Cloverbud in the Racine County Fair, here are some FAQs courtesy of the Cloverbud Superintendent, Kathy Ehrhart.

When is Cloverbud Judging?

Cloverbud judging takes place on the Monday before the fair officially opens. That is July 24th this year. Judging takes place from noon to 7, with a one-hour break at 3:30. You can arrive ANYTIME that afternoon/evening that works for you!

What do I do when I get there? When you arrive, you will take a number. The two judges will each meet with a child. When that child's turn is completed, the judge will call the next number to meet with a new exhibitor. (Similar to a deli counter!) Once your child is "judged," your family is free to leave!

Can I take my project home after it's been judged? Your child's projects will remain in the Cloverbud area of the Youth Building until Sunday night. Projects will be displayed for all fairgoers to enjoy throughout the week! Please plan to pick up your child's entries on Sunday evening or the Monday following the fair. More details about this process will be shared this summer.


What if I can't make it to the July 24th judging time? Each project area (department) in the Youth Building is judged during a specified time period, as noted in the fair rules for each department. Cloverbuds are only judged on Monday, July 24th. If your child is unable to attend on Monday, you can have another exhibitor share the projects with the judge, so that your child can still receive the ribbons and treats - and see his/her projects on display during the fair! It would be helpful to have your child write a sentence or two about each entry to tell the judge about the project creation. Another option would be to create a video of your child talking about the entries. A friend could then share that video with the judge on an iPad, phone, or other device.
