

RACINE COUNTY RAFFLE LICENSE

Did you know that the Racine County 4-H Leaders Association holds Raffle Licenses through the State of Wisconsin for both Class A and Class B type raffles? These licenses may be used by any of the Racine County 4-H Clubs and/or Projects to raise funds; however, please note that all profits must be used to further the purpose of 4-H in Racine County. (Both licenses can be used simultaneously.)
What's the difference between the two types?

A **Class A raffle** is the license type needed when tickets are sold in advance and the day of the raffle. Tickets are pre-printed with all raffle information on them. A winner need not be present to win.

A **Class B raffle** is the license type needed when tickets are only sold the day of the raffle. Generic raffle tickets may be used. A winner generally must be present to win. Bucket Raffles and 50/50 Raffles are common examples of a Class B raffle. Each Raffle must be reviewed and approved by the 4-H Leaders Association Board of Directors (BOD) prior to holding an event; the BOD meetings are held the first Thursday of each month. Please note that 4-H policies strictly prohibit any involvement of alcohol. If you are interested holding a raffle for your club or project or if you simply have any ideas or questions, please contact Jennifer DeYong at jendeyong@gmail.com.

WISCONSIN 4-H FOUNDATION CELEBRATES THE ARTS

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Celebrates the Arts is a contest, to be held annually for the purpose of:

- Promoting 4-H Arts Programming
- Raising Funds to Support 4-H Art Programs
- Telling the 4-H Story
- Raising Awareness of the WI 4-H Foundation and the 4-H Program
- Proceeds

Proceeds from any Celebrate the Arts events or sales will be split evenly with half invested in the Talen Endowment for 4-H Arts Programming and half used for arts programming in the next 4-H program year.

Celebrate the Arts 4-H Art Contest

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will sponsor the art contest, open to any current Wisconsin 4-H member, with cash prizes totaling nearly \$1,000. The contest will be held virtually, with photos of all entries submitted electronically.

The contest will be broken into nine categories (Drawing; Painting; Pottery/Ceramics/Clay; Photography; Paper; Fabric/Yarn/Fiber; Any Other Media; 4-H Art (non-photography); 4-H Art (photography).

Artists are STRONGLY encouraged to create art that has a 4-H theme or has root in their 4-H experience (example: a photo taken on a 4-H trip or of another 4-H member working on a 4-H project; a painting inspired by a 4-H event; pottery that incorporates the clover).
