HORSE CAMP POSITIONS

Youth Director (Horse): This position should be a horse project member. Youth who fill this role are typically older teens who have previous camp experience and are willing to take on leading the planning and coordination of a horse camp experience. This person will work closely with the Horse Project Key Leader and Adult Camp Coordinator to lead and support other youth leaders in facilitating a positive camp experience. The horse camp youth director will also act as the activity coordinator, choosing and planning the daily activities.

Activity Director (Horse or non-horse members): Youth who fill this role are ages 14 and up at the time of camp. This role does not require any experience with horses, although it will be helpful when organizing horse related activities. They have the responsibility of assisting the youth director in creating, organizing and implementing camp activities. These activities will be both with and without horses. They will help delegate other counselors and adults to lead each activity as needed.

Counselor (Horse members): Youth who fill this role are age 14 and up at the time of camp. They have the responsibility of guiding the campers and ensuring their safety. They should be experienced with horses and familiar with safety around horses. They have the responsibility of guiding the campers and ensuring their safety. Camp Counselors will lead camper groups, may lead activities, and provide direct instruction.

Counselor (Non-horse members): Youth who fill this role are ages 14 and up at the time of camp. They do not need prior horse experience, but should have camp counseling experience. They have the responsibility of guiding the campers and ensuring their safety. Camp Counselors will lead camper groups, may lead non-horse activities, and provide direct instruction. Depending on attendance and horse availability, they may be able to participate in some of the on-the-ground horse activities, but will not be able to ride.
