1	Gave leader record book on time	Record book is turned by due date indicated by the club.
2	Personalized record book binder and labeled with name	When turning in a physical record book, try to make the binder cover more identifiable and personalized. Include name on the binding and the cover. Binders are to be used for Kiwanis Award / County Awards & Experiences participants
3	Completed project sheet for each project	Project sheet are to have all sections completed.
4	Included 4-H media article with you in it	This can include a newspaper clipping or a digital article where you are named it. (Fair results are posted online at Racine County fair results)
5	Included your photo on first page of record book	Your annual about me page or for Cloverbuds, your Cloverbud record book
6	Attended 4-H club meetings	
7	Attended club project meetings	
8	* Member of club committee	Example: You are a member of the fundraising committee and have actively participated in the planning by attending meetings for the committee.
9	* Chairperson of club committee	Example: You are the Youth chairperson on the Community Service committee
10	* Club officer	You hold an office that is sworn-in by your club. Roles vary by club.
11	Helped with club project tour	Helped with arrangements of the tour or possibly helped other members at the tour
12	Attended club picnic, tour or trip	Example: You attended the end of year club Picnic.
13	* Helped with club community service	Example: You rang bells for the Salvation Army or volunteered at the Veteran's home with your club.
14	* Helped with club conservation project	
15	* Helped with club recycling project	
16	Helped with club June Dairy month project	Helped with the project that has been designated by your club officers as the June Dairy month project.

17	* Helped with club safety project	Helped with the project that has been designated by your club officers as the safety project
18	* Helped with club recreation	Helped plan, organize, or as a helper to the club recreation. Example: You helped plan a club Halloween party or You worked a game at your club's carnival.
19	Helped with club fund raiser	Club fundraisers are organized at the club level. This does not include the County fundraisers (County fundraisers usually start in January and are picked up in May (ie. Flowers))
20	Helped with club Achievement Night	Example: Handed out awards, provided a dish to pass
21	Helped start new club or new members start	Example: You helped with the creation of a new club. You are a buddy to a new club member
22	* Helped with community service not related to 4-H	Example: You volunteered at a nursing home on your own.
23	* Jr. Leader in a project	A Jr. Leader is a youth who works with an adult in a project or activity and is in 7th grade or above. They must be enrolled in 4-H online as a Youth Leader for the Project.
24	* Teen Leader in a project (2)	A Teen Leader leads independent of an adult as the project or activity leader. A Teen Leader must work independently in order to receive points for this category. The Teen must be enrolled in 4-H online as a Youth Leader for the Project.
25	* Jr. Leader in a 4-H activity	See 22. *Jr. Leader in a project
26	* Teen Leader in a 4-H activity (2)	See 23. *Teen Leader in a project
27	Gave talk at club meeting	Example: You spoke to the attendees of the club meeting about a 4-H trip or 4-H activity you attended. You spoke to recruit members to attend an event you were organizing.
28	Gave demonstration at club meeting	Gave a demonstration at a monthly club meeting OR project meeting Example: Demonstrating showmanship
29	Set your SMART goal for the 4-H year	Set a SMART goal on Page 2 (Your Personal Goal for this 4-H Year) of your Annual 'About Me' Record book
30	Completed summary of your 4-H year (2)	Wrote a 4-H summary on Page 3 (Year End Summary) of your Annual 'About Me' Record Book
31	* Other 4-H Club Activity	Example: Completed My Cloverbud Project, Brought treat to club meeting (at discretion of Club Leaders)

5	Attended Adventure Camp	Attended as a participant or as a counselor.
6	Attended Horse Camp	Attended as a participant or as a counselor.
7	Participated in Communications Arts Festival (2)	Had atleast one entry in the festival OR Volunteered to help at the event
8	Exhibited at Racine County Fair (2)	Had atleast one entry in the fair
9	Participated in a Poster contest	Participated in a Poster contest (excludes Communication Arts Festival)
10	Monitor 4-H building at Fair (2)	Volunteer for one of your club's shifts to watch the 4-H building at the fair.
11	*Helped at Fair (2)	Provided additional help excluding required barn duty

12	Attended County project meeting(s)	If participating in a county project (i.e. archery, poultry, rabbits) attended required project meetings.
13	Helped at a County project meeting	Example: Led an activity table at Rabbit Fun Day, Demonstrated Showmanship to New Project members,
14	Participated in Kiwanis Award Contest	Completed an essay for the Kiwanis Award contest. (see county 4-H website for details)
15	Attended Recognition Celebration	Attended the County-wide recognition celebration. This is held in the Fall (early November)
16	Volunteered at Racine County Breakfast on the Farm	
17	Attended 4 County Jr. Leader meetings	County Junior Leader Association meetings are open to any 4-H members 7th grade and up. They are held the 4th Monday of the month at Ives Grove @ 7pm.
18	Helped at Jr. Leader fundraiser (ie. Call booth)	
19	*Jr. Leader committee chair (2)	Chair or Co-chair a County Junior Leader Association defined committee. Example: You are a co-chair for the Night w/ the Stars committee
20	*Jr. Leader committee member	Member of a County Junior Leader Committee as defined by the Junior Leaders Association. Example: You are a member of the Night w/ the Stars committee and have actively participated in the planning by attending meetings for the committee
21	* Demonstration or Speaking Contest (2)	
22	*MC at County Event	Example: MC @ Communications Arts Festival
23	*Helped at County Event	Example: Helping at the Recognition Night
24	Helped with 4-H promotion (2)	
25	4-H Ambassador (2)	Ambassadors are selected through an application / interviewing process in the Fall of the 4-H year.
26	Participated in County Awards & Experiences Interviews	Applied and interviewed for the County Awards and Experiences. You do not have to receive an award or trip to receive a point.

1	Attended Multi-County meeting or workshop	Example: Attended Washington County Art Days
2	Helped at Regional meeting or workshop (2)	Example: Led a session at Washington County Arts Days or Fall Forum
3	Attended or Selected National Conference	Annually brings 4-H youth and adults from around the nation to work towards strengthening and expanding the 4-H Youth Dev. program at the local, state, and national levels.
4	Attended or Selected National Congress	National 4-H Congress is a five-day Educational Experience held in Atlanta, GA. Congress. Event for 4-Hers to network with others from around the country, Canada, and Puerto Rico.
5	Attended WLC Fall Forum	Fall Forum is an opportunity for youth and adult leaders to attend the statewide training weekend with county and state staff.
6	WI 4-H & Youth Conference Delegate	Wisconsin 4-H & Youth Conference is a 3 1/2 day Statewide Educational Experience. Youth from all over WI come to UW-Madison for educational seminars, assemblies, speakers, exploration, and fun
7	WI State Team - Arts/Comm/Drama/WLC (2)	Member of a State Art Team or WI 4-H Leadership Council (WLC), a youth and adult group of volunteers, works to help plan annual 4-H annual events and serve as ambassadors around the state.
8	*Participated at State Fair (2)	Exhibitor at the State Fair. Showed a project at the State Fair or performed/demonstrated/helped at the Youth Expo Building
