



WELCOME TO RACINE COUNTY 4-H ARCHERY 2025 Buck Trails Archery

To 4-H Archery Project Members,

We will start with orientation on <u>Friday April 25th at 6:30p.m.</u> at the Buck Trails Archery Club located on the Hwy 11 bypass just south of Burlington. <u>This meeting is required for all beginning archery members who have not had a family member in the archery project before, as we cover very <u>important safety instructions and equipment information.</u> If you have any equipment, be sure to bring it to the orientation night.</u>

The spot target sessions will be on Fridays, May 2nd and May 16th at 6:30p.m. for beginners only and Friday, May 23rd at 6:30 p.m. for beginners and 7:30 for advanced shooters. At these sessions, we will be focusing on learning and improving your archery abilities. Leaders will help adjust equipment and teach correct archery form and safety. **First year shooters must attend at least one spot target shoot or you will not be allowed to shoot outdoors**.

The outdoor sessions will begin on Thursday, May 29th at 6:00p.m. for beginners and 7:00p.m. for advanced. We will shoot eight sessions total. Please see the end of this letter for dates. **You must make five of the seven sessions. Scoring will come from an average of 4 practice sessions with your fifth session being your fair shooting score.** There will be no doubling up to make up. If you are short of the 5 sessions, you will earn a ribbon, but you will be dropped a ribbon place for each time you are short of the 5 sessions. If you need clarification as to which group you shoot with, generally ages 8-11 shoot as beginners and 12 and older shoot as advanced. Adult leaders will ultimately determine the appropriate level for each youth to shoot. To participate in the Racine County 4-H archery project you need to be at least 8 years of age and in at least 3rd grade by the first shoot.

The registration fee for the Archery Project is \$10.00 per archer with a maximum of \$20.00 per family, per shooting sports discipline, (archery, air pistol, .22 pistol, .22 rifle, air rifle, muzzleloading, & shotgun) per year. This fee helps to cover expenses for the shooting sports project. Please make checks payable to the **Racine County 4-H Leaders Association.**

CODE OF CONDUCT AGREEMENT

As a participant in 4-H Shooting Sports, you have the responsibility of representing Racine County to the public, so you are expected to conduct yourself in a manner that will bring honor to you and your family, as well as to 4-H. To do that, you will need to:

- Attend all sessions in the planned program. If you are not feeling well or have a schedule conflict that would keep you from attending, please tell the adult in charge.
- Follow rules established before the event begins. You are responsible to know the rules for each event
- Dress appropriately for each event. Your adults in charge should have guidelines to help you.
- Use language and manners that will bring respect to you and 4-H Shooting Sports. You are responsible to know what language and behavior is appropriate.
- Be in the assigned program area (for example: range being used for project) at all times.
- Know that the use of tobacco, alcohol, and non-prescribed drugs is illegal and prohibited at all 4-H events.
- Model respect for other persons in public areas.
- Treat program areas, shooting areas, and transportation vehicles with respect and care. You will be responsible for any damage, theft, or misconduct in which you participate.
- Help other members in your group have a pleasant experience by making every attempt to include all participants in activities.
- Live up to your highest expectations for yourself, so you can return home proud of who you are and what you have done.

Those who find themselves unable to conduct themselves within the guidelines listed above may expect:

- To explain their actions to the adults in charge.
- To accept the consequences of their actions.
- To have the adult in charge work closely with parents/guardians, Extension personnel, and others to see that actions taken, in case of unacceptable behavior, are appropriate and logical consequences for all concerns.
