



WELCOME TO RACINE COUNTY 4-H ARCHERY 2025 West Allis Bowmen

To all 4-H Archery Project Members,

ORIENTATION: There are two dates scheduled for orientation and safety. The sessions are held at West Allis Bowman (11601 County Truck G, Franksville). It is mandatory for all first-year participants to attend one of the orientation and safety sessions before their first time shooting at 4-H archery. To participate in the Racine County 4-H archery project you need to be at least 8 years of age and in at least 3rd grade by the first shoot. Members that feel they need a safety refresher may attend. The orientation sessions will be outdoors. Orientation begins at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, May 12th or Wednesday, May 21th.

At each orientation session, we will go over <u>safety rules</u>, <u>expectations</u>, <u>equipment needs</u>, <u>and proper use of that equipment</u>. There will be demonstrations. If you have equipment, please bring it with you. If you do not know how to purchase equipment, we can help you that evening. Equipment is available to use if you do not have your own equipment based on first come basis. If you are unable to attend or have scheduling conflicts, please call Kris Nissila, Archery Site Coordinator, at 262-757-5139.

There are over 50 members in our archery group, so please be prompt to your shooting line. It is important to be signed in, have your equipment ready, and your cases set aside appropriately before your assigned time to shoot. Your full cooperation is needed. We have several certified instructors, and it helps if they are able to focus on instructing. Project leaders or parents are encouraged to volunteer to keep score.

The registration fee for the Archery Project is \$10.00 per archer with a maximum of \$20.00 per family, per discipline, (archery, air pistol, .22 pistol, .22 rifle, air rifle, muzzleloading, and shotgun) per year. This fee helps to cover expenses for the Shooting Sports Project. Please make the check payable to **Racine County 4-H Leaders Association.**

Make sure to sign up for the <u>Archery Project</u> under Shooting Sports on your <u>fair entry form</u> on the Racine County Fair website at http://www.racinecountyfair.com. We will not be shooting archery at the fair. Racine County Fair ribbon distribution will be addressed by the Racine County Fair at a future date. Typically, ribbons can be picked up at the Youth Building office at the Racine County Fair starting on Monday of fair week.

LEAGUE INFORMATION

We will have a three-week outdoor league at West Allis Bowman. That enables you to shoot a possible 12 times. The leagues will be on **Monday's and Wednesday's with a 5:30 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. shooting line.** You will need 5 scores from the outdoor league. The first 4 scores are averaged, and you compete against your own average, not against the other shooters for your award. Complications may be discussed and worked out with the head leader. They must be good reasons, not just other fun. You do not have to be an exceptional shooter to enjoy this project.

It is very important to be on time and this means signed up and ready to shoot by your designated time. If you are late, you will be put on the line and will start shooting the same round as the rest of the line. If there is time when the line is done shooting, you can make up the rounds you missed.

EQUIPMENT

Bow, 6 arrows, finger tab or release, side quiver, bow case, and arm guard. Check eye dominance. We use burlap animal targets for shooting outdoors.

RULES

- There will be no fooling around at any time. If you are caught fooling around you will be dropped from the archery project. We don't want anyone to get hurt.
- Your bow must be in a case when it is being transported.
- No shooting is to begin until the whistle is blown once. Always remain behind the shooting line until the whistle is blown twice to go pull your arrows from the target. <u>If the</u> whistle is blown multiple times STOP SHOOTING, there is a problem.
- Straddle the shooting line.
- Never dry fire a bow.
- Never pick up a dropped arrow.
- No pulling arrows until the leader scores them.

9 STEPS TO SHOOTING

- 1. Stance left side to target (or right side to target if you are left-handed shooter)
- 2. Grip "shake hands" with your bow
- 3. Nock your arrow cock feather. Learn cock feather direction for your set up. The arrow should "click" onto the bow string. Nock arrow with the bow up and down not sideways, so they don't hit other archers or their equipment.
- 4. Draw with first three fingers (there are other styles, this is for beginners).
- 5. Anchor (corner of mouth or release) head straight, don't bow to string or tip head back.
- 6. Aim sights or instinctive no looking down the shaft.
- 7. Release relax fingers or trip release. More details when shooting.
- 8. Follow through hold bow up and still until arrow reaches the target.
- 9. Check equipment.

CODE OF CONDUCT AGREEMENT

As a participant in 4-H Shooting Sports, you have the responsibility of representing Racine County to the public, so you are expected to conduct yourself in a manner that will bring honor to you and your family, as well as to 4-H. To do that, you will need to:

- Attend all sessions in the planned program. If you are not feeling well or have a schedule conflict that would keep you from attending, please tell the adult in charge.
- Follow rules established before the event begins. You are responsible to know the rules for each event
- Dress appropriately for each event. Your adults in charge should have guidelines to help you.
- Use language and manners that will bring respect to you and 4-H Shooting Sports. You are responsible to know what language and behavior is appropriate.
- Be in the assigned program area (for example: range being used for project) at all times.
- Know that the use of tobacco, alcohol, and non-prescribed drugs is illegal and prohibited at all 4-H events.
- Model respect for other persons in public areas.
- Treat program areas, shooting areas, and transportation vehicles with respect and care. You will be responsible for any damage, theft, or misconduct in which you participate.
- Help other members in your group have a pleasant experience by making every attempt to include all participants in activities.
- Live up to your highest expectations for yourself, so you can return home proud of who you are and what you have done.

Those who find themselves unable to conduct themselves within the guidelines listed above may expect:

- To explain their actions to the adults in charge.
- To accept the consequences of their actions.
- To have the adult in charge work closely with parents/guardians, Extension personnel, and others to see that actions taken, in case of unacceptable behavior, are appropriate and logical consequences for all concerns.
